- a. Steve Barilar, Department of Public Safety
 - 1. Last year transports: 25 (4 firstyears)
 - 2. This year: 44 (26 firstyears) / intensive care
 - 3. Drug law last year: 5

 - 5. Majority of violations downtown are open container and fake ID's. situation is better than last year (from Yost)
